First Grade Supply List

Dear Parents,

Welcome to Brookwood! We are looking forward to a wonderful year with your children. Following is a list of items that would be helpful for each first grader to have for the 2011-2012 school year.

1. One (1) large box of tissues - to be used in the classroom as needed
2. One (1) bottle of Elmer's white Glue-All (4 fl. oz.) (Please note the brand name)
3. Two (2) dozen pencils (quality brand)
4. Book bag (no wheels) *see note
5. One (1) Mead composition book-bound 100 pages (no spiral notebook)
6. Fiskars Scissors (Please note the brand name)
7. One (1) box thick Crayola Classic Markers (primary colors)
8. Three (3) boxes of Crayola crayons (box of 24)
9. One (1) box Ziploc Bags (**girls- gallon, boys- sandwich size**)
10. One (1) package of thick Expo dry erase markers
11. Three (3) **plastic** pocket folders – NO BRADS – any color
12. One (2) tub of **unscented** baby wipes
13. Twelve (12) glue sticks
14. Three (3) First grade D'Nealian handwriting tablets
15. One (1) pink Pearl eraser

It would be very helpful if you could bring the above supplies on registration day, 8:00 – 11:00 am on Thursday August 4, 2011. Some materials may need to be replenished during the school year and your child's teacher may request a few other items when school starts. We ask that your children not bring toys, gum, or candy to school. We also ask that your children not bring trapper keepers and school boxes because of limited storage space.

We want to make optimum use of instructional time. We're asking your help in remembering that our instructional hours are 8:50-3:20. Students may enter the school building at 8:20 am. Morning video announcements will begin at 8:45 am. Students must be in their classroom at 8:50 a.m. to avoid being tardy. Tardiness and early checkouts interfere with learning activities that require teacher instruction.

*Note - Book bags with wheels are not needed in the lower grades, as heavy books are not taken home. Wheeled book bags are also a safety concern in the hallway.
